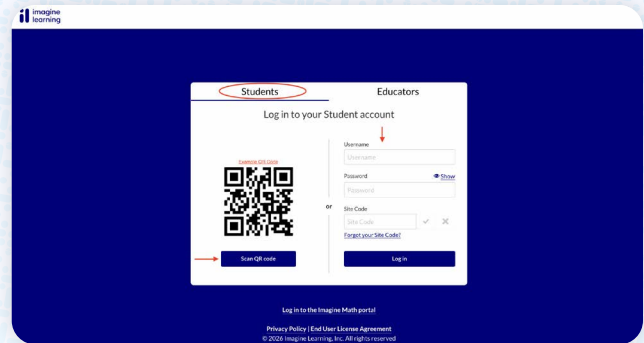

GET STARTED!

Your student will log in to Traverse using the username/password combination or QR code provided by the school.

If your district uses a single sign-on (SSO) portal, such as Clever or ClassLink, follow the instructions provided by your student's teacher.

Once logged in, students can access content assigned to them by their teacher. Students develop foundational content knowledge and then apply, investigate, and discuss that knowledge in inquiry-based activities.

How to Support Learning at Home

If your student wants to explore Traverse beyond the classroom, consider these tips:

- Create a comfortable, distraction-free space for learning.
- Establish a routine that includes focused work time and breaks.
- Ensure your student has a device or print materials available.
- Encourage your student to discuss recent teachings.
- Ask questions such as:
 - What compelling question are you investigating right now?
 - What sources have you read this week?
 - What new perspective did you learn about today?
 - What evidence helped you form your conclusion?

These conversations help students deepen their understanding of social studies topics, strengthen their ability to communicate ideas, and feel connected to their learning.

Connecting with Your Student's Teacher

Communicating regularly with your student's teacher helps create a strong support system for learning and keeps you informed on your student's progress and learning experiences. Teachers can provide guidance about assignments, upcoming projects, and ways to support your student's learning outside of school.
